Program of the Year

The Program of the Year award is divided into (3) three categories based on the population served: Internal, Emory Community, and External; (1) one student organization will be awarded per category. Eligible programs could include a one-time event, a semester-long series, or a continued tradition. This award seeks less to recognize events of high volume and more of those with greatest impact.

Emory Community

Programs eligible for the Emory Community Program of the Year award were put on by a student organization at Emory University with an open, inclusive benefit to the whole Emory community. This event's presence is felt by the entire Emory community and creates an intentional impact on the campus.

Scoring Rubric

Impactful Nature of the Program:

To what extent did the program create a significant and positive impact on the entire Emory community? Consider how well the program went beyond routine activities to achieve meaningful and lasting effects on campus life.

Open and Inclusive Benefit to the Whole Emory Community:

To what extent did the program cater to and benefit a diverse range of individuals within the Emory community? Consider how effectively the program promoted inclusivity and ensured accessibility to a broad audience.

Visibility and Presence Across Campus:

To what extent was the program's presence felt across various parts of the Emory campus? Consider how well the program engaged with different segments of the campus community.

Intentional Impact on the Campus:

To what extent did the program demonstrate intentional planning to make a positive impact on the Emory campus? Consider how effectively the program contributed to the broader goals and well-being of the Emory community.

Innovation and Creativity in Program Design:

To what extent did the program demonstrate innovative and creative elements? Consider how well the program stood out in terms of its unique approach to engaging the Emory community.
