Program of the Year

The Program of the Year award is divided into (3) three categories based on the population served: Internal, Emory Community, and External; (1) one student organization will be awarded per category. Eligible programs could include a one-time event, a semester-long series, or a continued tradition. This award seeks less to recognize events of high volume and more of those with greatest impact.

Internal

Programs eligible for the Internal Program of the Year award were put on by a student organization at Emory University to benefit members of that student organization, a specific and defined student population. This population could include

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Scoring Rubric

Impactful Nature of the Program:

To what extent did the program demonstrate a significant and positive impact on the targeted audience within the student organization? Consider how the program went beyond routine activities to create meaningful and lasting effects.

Relevance to the Student Organization's Goals:

To what extent did the program align with the goals and mission of the student organization? Consider how well the program contributed to advancing the organization's overall objectives.

Engagement Level of the Targeted Student Population:

To what extent did the program actively engage and involve the specific and defined student population? Consider how effectively the program captured the attention and participation of the intended audience.

Being Put on by Members for Members:

To what extent was the program initiated and executed by members of the student organization for the benefit of their peers? Consider how actively members involved in the planning, execution, and participation in the program.

Innovation and Creativity in Program Design:

To what extent did the program demonstrate innovative and creative elements? Consider how well the program stood out in terms of its unique approach.
