Undergraduate Student Organization Leader of the Year

This student must hold a leadership position for a chartered or departmental organization. The recipient of this award will, through their leadership position, make proactive and positive contributions to their fellow undergraduate peers and their experiences by virtue of their dedicated actions and service to the Emory undergraduate community.

Unique Requirements:

- Must have served in their leadership position for the organization within the current academic year

Scoring Rubric

To what extent does the student exemplify exceptional leadership? Consider the student's behavior, decision-making, and actions as a leader.

To what extent does the student demonstrate principled behavior in their leadership role? Evaluate the alignment of the student's actions with ethical principles and values.

To what extent does the student commit to inspiring positive transformation? Assess the impact of the student's leadership on bringing about positive change within the undergraduate community.

To what extent does the student actively serve their undergraduate community? Consider the nature and extent of the student's service to the Emory undergraduate community.

To what extent does the student's leadership position contribute proactively to the undergraduate peers' experiences? Evaluate how the student, through their role, enhances the experiences of fellow undergraduate peers.

To what extent are the student's actions and service dedicated to the Emory undergraduate community? Consider the level of dedication demonstrated by the student in serving and contributing to the Emory undergraduate community.
